

1. Scott Richards Coast Path walk

Start: 10am for 10.30am Scott Richards Offices

FREE

A walk from the Scott Richards office in Teignmouth along the coastal path to Dawlish and then onto Dawlish Warren. A celebration of the beautiful and wildlife-rich coastline we have around Dawlish, with refreshments provided for walkers at their offices from 10am. The walk will leave Scott Richards at around 10.30am. If you live in Dawlish and want to get to the start and walk back, Dawlish Community Transport will be providing a 16 seater bus from Barton car park at 9.45am to Teignmouth. Seats are free but must be pre-booked with Dawlish TIC.

2. Beach and town litter pick

3. Holcombe to Teignmouth Golf Course walk

A 5.5 mile walk led by Dawlish and Teignmouth Ramblers. Bus from Dawlish at 9.54am to Holcombe. Route: Strawberry Lane, Holcombe Down Road, Golf Club, Bishop's Palace, Broadmeadow. Bus back to Dawlish. One long hill up, one long hill down. No dogs.

4. Foraging walk



8. Walk this Way short, medium and long walks

Start: 10.30am Railway viaduct





9. Mamhead Obelisk walk

Start: 9am Bandstand FREE

A 9 mile walk led by Dawlish and Teignmouth Ramblers to the Obelisk and back via Clump of Firs (Seven Sisters), Long Lane, Langdon, Barton, Oak Park Lane, Roger's Path, the Obelisk and return via various green lanes. Moderately hard, up and down multiple hills. No dogs.

10. Photography walk with Dawlish and Teignmouth Camera Club

Start: 2pm Bandstand

FREE

A leisurely tour of photogenic subjects around the town accompanied by members of the Dawlish and Teignmouth Camera Club. There will be an opportunity to discover what this friendly local group can offer and to look at familiar places in new ways, to discuss images, and to develop your photo skills. Any camera, including smartphones, will be fine.

11. Powderham Castle grounds

Start 2pm at Powderham Castle Car Park or 1.30pm for Minibus Cost: £3

An opportunity to see parts of the Powderham Castle grounds not normally viewed by members of the public. Up to a 2 hour walk that may be hilly. Numbers limited to 25. 16 spaces are also available on a Dawlish Community Transport minibus from Barton Car Park leaving at 1.30pm. Must be pre-booked through the Dawlish TIC. No dogs.

12. Dawlish Countryside Park with Rangers

Meet at Starcross Car Park for 10.30am (No 2 bus from Dawlish Brookdale Terrace 9.55am), walk along the Exe Estuary Trail to Turf Locks. Buy lunch or drink at Turf Locks staying for about 1 hour enjoying the views and walk back.
