Ryders Bakery (open 8am – 5pm)

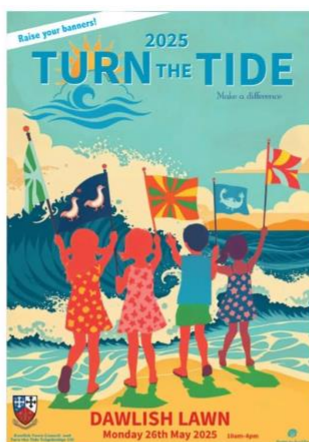
